Ethics in the Virtual Workspace

On Wednesday, March 24th, a group of career practitioners met on Zoom for a CCCDA "Noontime Conversation" to discuss "Ethics in the Virtual Workplace". Not surprisingly, much of the conversation centered on working ethically virtually in career counseling or teaching situations. Some of the key points that we discussed included: be certain to ensure your client's/student's privacy. This means ensuring that the client is talking with you from a private space, that client records are securely maintained, and that you don't review a client's social media postings without their permission. In addition, career counselors need to inform their clients about the security of various forms of communication (i.e. text messages, e-mail, etc.). The counselor should encrypt his/her e-mail messages and should ensure that clients are aware that, without encryption, their e-mail communications are not secure.

We also learned about the internet site www.brandyourself.com that allows an individual to view what information is out on the internet about them and it allows them to "clean up" and/or remove their internet information. Other concerns that arose as we talked included being sure to draw boundaries for when and how you interact with a student/client – thus, for example, not friending a current client/student on Facebook or other platform (though some colleges encourage students and staff/faculty to connect via LinkedIn) and being clear with your student/client when and how you can be contacted between appointments/classes. Informed consent is also an essential aspect of virtual counseling. Sufficient information must be shared about what to do if the internet service fails while you're talking with an individual. The nature of the services to be provided should be covered as should alternative ways to communicate, the risks and benefits of each alternative, and what the counselor's/teacher's social media policy is.
